



Notice of Race

2014 Laser Radial Youth World Championships

26 July - 02 August-2014

Venue: Dziwnów, POLAND

**Organizing Authority: Gmina Dziwnów, the Polish Yachting Association (Host)
and the International Laser Class Association (ILCA)**

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the 'rules' as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing. The prescriptions of the National Authority will not apply.
- 1.2 Laser class rule 7 (a) is restricted as follows:
Only one person shall be on board while racing. The person shall be named on the entry form.
- 1.3 Appendix P "Special Procedures for Rule 42" will apply with changes to include; allowing a jury initiated redress, a points penalty for a first penalty given after finishing and to prohibit a boat that has been disqualified for a rule 42 infringement or has retired in recognition of a rule 42 infringement from sailing in the race if that race is restarted or re-sailed.
- 1.4 Advertising - The organizing authority may require competing boats to carry event sponsor advertising.

2. ENTRY REGULATIONS

- 2.1 Only current, fully paid members of the International Laser Class Association and of an ISAF National Authority may enter the regatta. These memberships shall be with the Laser Fleet/District Association and with the ISAF National Authority of the country, where the sailor normally sails, even though such place may not be his permanent residence; however, such member, for any valid reason and with the approval of both District Chairmen, may select instead the Fleet/District and the ISAF National Authority in which he has permanent residence in accordance with the ILCA Constitution, Article 10 (3) and the ILCA Class Rules, Part Two, Article 9. The sailor can only be member of one Laser Fleet/District Association.
- 2.2 Crew substitution of the registered sailor is not permitted.
- 2.3 No resale of entries is allowed.
- 2.4 This is an allocated place event. Each sailor shall apply using the official online application form (see paragraph 3.)
- 2.5 Each sailor shall have an ISAF Sailor ID, which is required to enter the regatta. An ISAF Sailor ID can be obtained free of charge by registering online at: <http://members.sailing.org/profiles/profile.php>
- 2.6 Entry is restricted to experienced sailors who are, or will be at least 15 years old but not 19 years or older in the year in which the championship begins i.e. born in 1996, 1997, 1998 or 1999. Proof of age will be required at registration.
- 2.7 Each sailor under 18 years old on 26 July 2014 must present a completed parent/guardian consent form at the regatta site before the close of registration on 27 July 2014. Forms should be brought to the regatta site, not sent to ILCA. The consent form will be automatically emailed to each sailor upon completing the online entry form.
- 2.8 For the duration of the championship, each sailor under 18 years old shall be supervised by the responsible adult named on the parent/guardian consent form.
- 2.9 The responsible adult (if applicable) and competitor shall register together on site at the race office before 1800 on 27 July 2014.
- 2.10 The total number of entries is restricted to 420 sailors.

3. ENTRY APPLICATION & ENTRY PROCESS

- 3.1 Applications for entry will be accepted until 23 March 2014, 2359 GMT, with payment of the \$US50 application fee which will be deducted from the entry fee, retained by ILCA or refunded to the sailor under certain circumstances detailed in 3.11. The application fee and entry fee payments can only be made by credit card. If you have several credit cards you should use one with an **expiry date after the 31 December 2014**.
- Reason: ILCA can only make refunds to the same credit card used to pay for application and entry.*
- 3.2 Application for entry shall be made at the ILCA regatta website.
- 3.3 After 23 March 2014 up until 30 March 2014 the National Laser Association will rank the applications from its country. All sailors that are ranked within the country allocation limit (see the ILCA regatta website for allocation limits) will receive a place offer. Applications ranked lower than the country allocation limit will be added to the waiting list. National Laser Associations can refuse a sailor's application based upon ability or membership status.
- 3.4 All applications will be responded to by 31 March 2014, being informed by email that:
- a place has been offered, or
 - the application has been added to the waiting list, or
 - the application has been declined by the National Laser Association.
- 3.5 Extra places will be offered to sailors on the waiting list, as available, from 14 April 2014.
- 3.6 Sailors offered a place will have 2 weeks to complete entry. The application fee is not refundable if a sailor is offered a place and fails to accept or refuse the offered place within two weeks of it being offered.
- 3.7 The entry fee for this event is \$US375.
- 3.8 The entry closing date is 1 July 2014.
- 3.9 After 1 July 2014 entries will only be accepted at the discretion of ILCA and upon payment of a late entry fee of \$US450 (\$US375 + \$US75).

LATE APPLICATION

- 3.10 Sailors who do not apply for an entry by 23 March 2014 have very little chance to attend the regatta. A sailor who has not applied by 23 March 2014 may nevertheless make a late application from 31 March 2014 until 1 July 2014. Once the National Laser Association has accepted and ranked the late application it will be automatically added to the waiting list.

CANCELLATION & REFUND

- 3.11 Refund of the **application fee**:
- 3.11.1. As in 3.6 above, the application fee is not refundable if a sailor is offered a place and fails to accept or refuse the offered place within two weeks of it being offered.
 - 3.11.2. The **full application fee less bank charges of \$US5** will be refunded if:
 - the application is refused by the National Laser Association / District, or
 - the application is cancelled via the the link provided in the confirmation email before the application is ranked by the National Laser Association / District, or
 - the sailor is not offered an allocated place in the initial place round, the application is automatically added to the waiting list for an extra place and the sailor decides to cancel via the link provided in the confirmation email.
 - the applicant is not offered a place, or
 - the applicant is offered a place and refuses the offered place within two weeks of it being offered.

In all instances above, the sailor will receive an email confirming the refund. If the confirmation email is not received by the sailor the ILCA office must be contacted immediately. Failure to do so may lead to the loss of the refund.

- 3.12 Refund of the **entry fee**:
- 3.12.1. If a sailor cancels the entry before the entry closing date, which is 1 July 2014 the full entry fee less a \$US50 fee for bank and administration charges will be refunded approximately one week after the entry closing date.
 - 3.12.2. **No entry fee is refundable for cancellations after 1 July 2014.**

- 3.13 Refunds are made to the credit card used to pay the entry fee. If at the time of the refund (the latest by 31 December 2014) the expiry date of your card has passed (but the number has remained the same) the refund is still possible, but is much more complicated and will therefore take longer. If you have changed your credit card in the meantime (new card type and/or new number) then the refund can only be made with a bank transfer (expenses split.) Please contact the ILCA office in this case.

4. CHARTER BOATS

- 4.1 At this time there are no charter boats provided by ILCA. ILCA is working to arrange for charter boats for this event, but cannot guarantee a supply. Competitors should check the event web-site for information on charter boat suppliers.

5. BOATS AND EQUIPMENT

- 5.1 All competitors shall use only one hull, sail, batten set, mast, boom, centreboard and rudder; all of which shall be identified during equipment inspection.
- 5.2 In the event of damage, boats and equipment may only be substituted with the written permission of the regatta measurer in accordance with the sailing instructions.
- 5.3 For the purposes of Appendix G1.1, sails shall display the national letters of the ISAF member national authority under which the entry was accepted (see 2.1 above.) This changes Appendix G1.1.
- 5.4 Boats shall not be towed unless flag T is displayed ashore or on the race committee signal boat. When flag T is displayed a tow shall not exceed 8 knots.
- 5.5 When ashore boats shall be kept in their assigned places at the venue.
- 5.6 Boats may be required to display identification numbers.
- 5.7 Boats may be required to carry cameras, sound equipment or positioning equipment as specified by the organizing authority.
- 5.8 Access to the boat park may be restricted during certain hours including the hours of darkness.

6. RACING FORMAT

- 6.1 The boy entries may be divided into fleets to sail a qualifying series followed by a final series.
- 6.2 The girl entries may be divided into fleets to sail a qualifying series followed by a final series.
- 6.3 If 4 races of a qualifying series have not been completed by the end of the fourth scheduled racing day, that qualifying series will continue until the end of the racing day in which a fourth qualifying race is completed.
- 6.4 A qualifying series race will not count until all qualifying series fleets have completed that race.

7. PROGRAM

- 7.2 The time of the first warning signal for the practice race will be 1400.
- 7.3 The time for the first warning signal on 28 July will be 1100.
- 7.4 Each day succeeding races will be started as soon as practicable after the finish of the previous race.
- 7.5 Any race whose warning signal is not given by 1500 on the last day of the championship will be abandoned and not resailed.

8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Copies of sailing instructions will be available from the race office during registration and from the ILCA championship website from 1 July 2014.

9. RACE OFFICE

- 9.1 The race office is located at ul. Żeromskiego 30 72-420 Dziwnów, Poland.

- 9.2 The race office is open:
26-27 July from 0900-1200 & 1300-1800
28 July to 02 August from 0900 until 30 minutes after the close of the protest time unless extended at the discretion of the race committee

10. EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

- 10.1 Information on equipment inspection will be posted on the official notice board. Boats shall be presented with all equipment that will be used in the regatta, with the bottom mast, boom and all control lines rigged and with the sail and top section derigged ready for inspection.
- 10.2 Equipment inspection will take place at the boat park between the following dates and times:
26-27 July from 0900-1200 & 1300-1800
- 10.3 Equipment inspection outside these times will only be possible at the discretion of the regatta measurer and on payment of €20 (Euros).
- 10.4 Wet clothing and equipment checks may be made throughout the regatta at the discretion of the class representative, race committee or the jury.

11. COACH REGISTRATION & TEAM/COACH/SUPPORT BOATS

- 11.1 All coach/support boats shall register online at the ILCA regatta website before 1 July 2014.
- 11.2 All coach/support boat drivers shall confirm registration of their boats and submit the names and sails numbers of the sailors they are supporting at the race office before 1800 on 27 July 2014.
- 11.3 Each coach/support boat shall be clearly display an identification number supplied by the organizing authority. No other individual support boats shall be used. A deposit of €10 (Euros) may be required for the identification number.
- 11.4 Each coach/support boat is required to carry a VHF radio capable of transmitting and receiving all international ship to ship channels.
- 11.5 Coach boat drivers and crews shall wear a life jacket or other adequate personal buoyancy securely fastened at all times when afloat except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Wet suits and dry suits do not constitute adequate personal buoyancy.
- 11.6 When the coach boat engine is running coach boat drivers shall be connected to a device that will stop the engine if the boat driver falls out the boat or is otherwise not in control of the boat.
- 11.7 The movements of coach/support boats will be restricted as defined in the sailing instructions.
- 11.8 There will be a coaches meeting at the race office 2.5 hours before the first scheduled start time of the first race each day. The objectives of these meetings are to receive feedback from the coaches on the regatta organization, exchange view points and inform the coaches about changes in the sailing instructions and regatta organization in general.

12. COURSES

A trapezoid course will be used with inner and outer loops and an upwind finish. The target time for the first boat in each race will be 60 minutes.

13. INTERNATIONAL JURY

An international jury will be appointed in accordance with rule Appendix N and perform the duties listed in RRS N2.

14. WHISTLE SYSTEM

To encourage boats to take penalties afloat, jury members may blow a whistle when they see what they believe to be a breach of a rule.

15. ALTERNATIVE PENALTIES

For protests where only a rule of Part 2 is alleged to have been broken, an arbitration hearing may be offered prior to any formal protest hearing.

16. APPEALS

There shall be no appeal from the decisions of the jury.

17. RADIO COMMUNICATION

A boat shall neither make radio communication while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

18. ANTI-DOPING & DRUG TESTING

- 18.1 Competitors are required to comply with the rule 5 and ISAF Regulation 21, which ban the use of certain drugs.
- 18.2 Drugs testing may take place during the event.

19. SAFETY

Each competitor shall wear a life jacket or other adequate personal buoyancy at all times when afloat. Wet suits and dry suits do not constitute adequate personal buoyancy.

20. SCORING

- 20.1 A total of four races are required to be completed to constitute a championship.
- 20.2 When from four to nine races have been completed one race score will be excluded.
- 20.3 When ten or more races have been completed two races scores will be excluded.
- 20.4 When a qualifying/final series is sailed.
 - (a) The qualifying series races and the final series races will count for total points in the championship.
 - (b) A qualifying series race will not count until all qualifying series fleets have completed that race.
 - (c) One qualifying series race score will be excluded when calculating the division into final series fleets.
 - (d) If only one final series race is completed it will not be excluded.
 - (e) If two or more final series races are completed then a maximum of one final series race score may be excluded.
 - (f) For the purposes of Appendix A4.2 "Scoring" the number of boats entered into a qualifying series race will be the number of boats assigned to the largest qualifying fleet.
- 20.5 For the purposes of Appendix A11 "Scoring abbreviations": ARB means scoring penalty after arbitration, PTS scoring penalty for a yellow flag after finishing, and UFD means a disqualification under instruction 14.2 (U flag).

21. TITLES & PRIZES

Laser Radial Youth World Championship

- 21.1 The first boy sailor in the championship will be the 2014 Laser Radial Youth Boys World Champion.
- 21.2 The first Under-17 boy sailor will be awarded the Laser Radial Youth Under-17 Boys prize.
- 21.3 The first girl sailor in the championship will be the 2014 Laser Radial Youth Girls World Champion 2014.
- 21.4 The first Under-17 girl sailor will be awarded a Laser Radial Youth Under-17 Girls prize.
- 21.5 Under-17 sailors are those sailors that will not become 17 or older in 2014.
- 21.6 Under-17 results will be determined by the series score in the overall championship.
(Note: This means that under 17 results are extracted without recalculation)

ILCA Cube Prizes

- 21.7 ILCA cube prizes will be awarded in accordance with the ILCA Honour Award By-Law.

22. PHOTOGRAPHY CONSENT

By entering the regatta competitors accept that they may be photographed and/or videotaped participating in the regatta and/or using the regatta facilities and they consent to the taking of such images and to the use, reuse, publication and republication of such images in any media, in conjunction with the competitors name or not, without compensation and without the competitors approval of such images or any use thereof.

23. LIABILITY

- 23.1 Gmina Dziwnów, the Polish Yachting Association, the International Laser Class Association and all their officers, members and volunteers do not accept liability for loss of life or property, or personal injury or damage caused by or arising out of the regatta and competitors take part in the regatta at their own risk.
- 23.2 The establishment of the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions in no way limits or reduces the complete and unlimited responsibilities of a competitor being solely and entirely responsible for his actions, including the management of a boat he is sailing.
- 23.3 All competitors shall maintain their boats in a safe and seaworthy condition.
- 23.4 A competitor shall be of good health and a competent sailor capable of racing a Laser Radial in open water in all conditions including strong winds.
- 23.5 It is the responsibility of each sailor to decide to participate in a race or to continue racing.

- 23.6 All competitors shall be insured with valid third party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$300,000 USD per event or equivalent thereof in any other currency.
- 23.7 A competitor is recommended to have personal accident and health insurance that covers him while attending the regatta and while racing.

24. INDEMNIFICATION

To the fullest extent permitted by law, each competitor agrees to indemnify and hold the International Laser Class Association, Gmina Dziwnów, the Polish Yachting Association, their owners, affiliates, officers, employees, agents, committee persons and race officials acting in their official capacities harmless, from any third party claim to the extent arising from a competitor's acts or omissions.
